

ABOUT THE SPEAKERS AND EXPERTS

Craig Wood, Ph.D. (welcome address) is Acting Associate Dean and Director of Cooperative Extension, and Assistant Director of Extension for Agriculture, Natural Resources and Horticulture at the University of Kentucky.

Margaret D. Lowman, Ph.D. (keynote speaker) is a renowned scientist, conservationist, master arborist, science communicator, and author. Internationally known as "Canopy Meg."

Lionel Bradford (keynote speaker) is President and Executive Director of *The Greening of Detroit*, an initiative that has overseen planting and care of nearly 150,000 trees.

David Morgan (speaker) is President of the 21st Century Parks - The Park Lands of Floyds Fork in Jefferson County, Kentucky, an interconnected urban park system that belts the outskirts of Louisville.

Mitzi Bender (panel moderator) is Member of the Board of Directors of Andover Forest Homeowners Association in Lexington, KY, creating an urban forest from a former golf course area.

Nachie Braga (field demonstration, urban water) is the founder of Geomancer Permaculture, an award-winning agroecology landscape design organization.

Dave Leonard (field demonstration, urban soil) is a certified master arborist and tree advocate with more than 40 years of experience in the arboriculture profession.

Nathan Skinner (field demonstration, management of urban public woodlands) is an urban arborist with the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government.

David Brown, Ph.D. (field demonstration, urban wildlife) is an expert of birds and a professor of Biological Sciences and Manager of the Taylor Fork Ecological Area at Eastern Kentucky University.

Clare Rittschof, Ph.D. (field demonstration, urban pollinators) is an expert on honeybees and associate professor of Entomology at the University of Kentucky.

Lynn Roche Phillips, Ph.D. A.I.C.P. (field demonstration, urban planning and trees) is an urban planner and associate professor of Geography at the University of Kentucky.

Nic Williamson (field demonstration, tree health) is a certified master arborist and Arboriculture Superintendent for the University of Kentucky campus.

Ignazio Graziosi, Ph.D. (field demonstration, tree health) is a forest entomologist and Program Coordinator for the Urban Forest Initiative.
