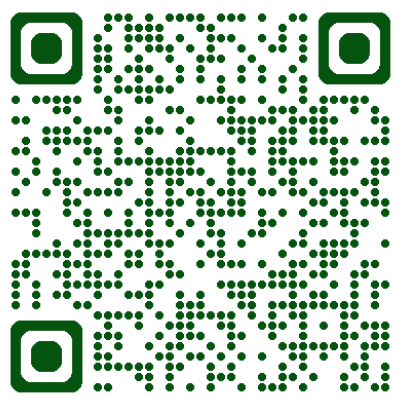

Scientific name: *Fraxinus pennsylvanica*

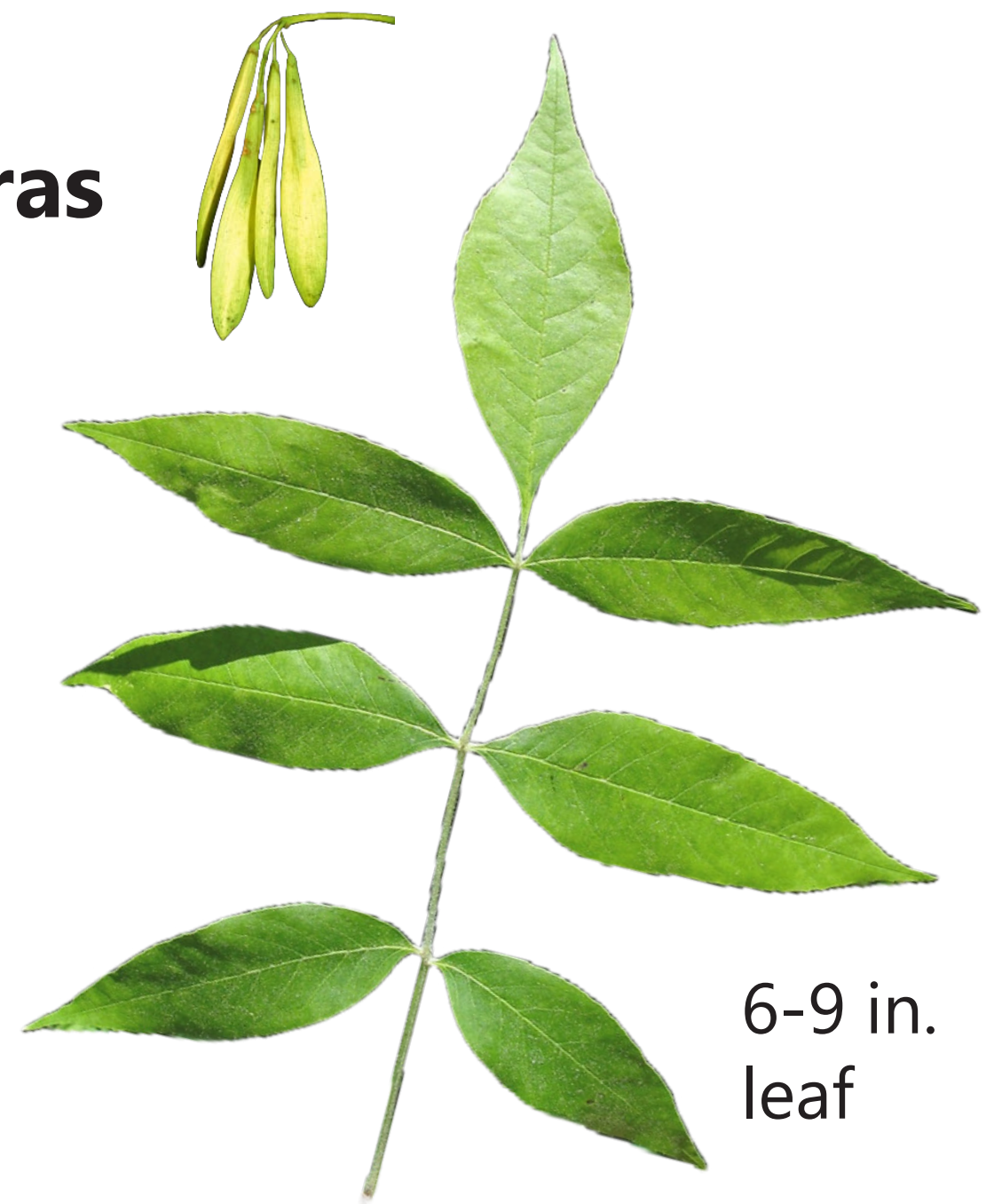


Native Americans used the **bark** to make **red dye**, **baskets**, and more



Quails, turkeys, and other birds **eat the fruit**

Fruits are winged **smaras**



6-9 in. leaf

The invasive **emerald ash borer** (EAB) threatens all species of ash: the EAB larvae, dig tunnels under the bark, killing the tree.



Over 20 years, one green ash* will capture

**of 12" diameter in size, if taken care of*



2,656 car miles of CO₂,



the weight of **30 smartphones** in air pollution,



and **1,057 bathtubs** of stormwater!
