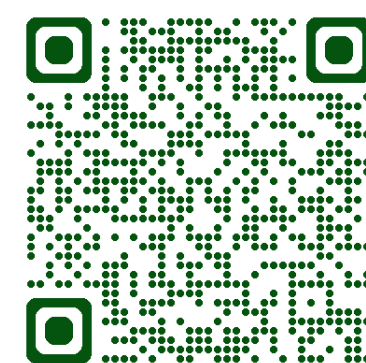


You found a Western redcedar!

Scientific name: *Thuja plicata*



It is native to the Pacific Northwest where it **can live for over 1,000 years!**



Branchlet
(leaves are scale-like and 2mm long)



Its **fibrous bark** was historically used for making **ropes, baskets, and clothing**



Bagworms (a type of caterpillar) live in spindle-shaped silk bags that hang from the tree

Over 20 years, one Western redcedar* will capture

**of 10" diameter in size, if taken care of*



650 car miles of CO₂,



the weight of **38 smartphones in air pollution,**



and **416 bathtubs of stormwater!**
